WELCOME AND INTRODUCTION

Leader:

Elin Kelsey in her book, *Hope Matters*, ¹ tells us that, "What we pay attention to shapes our lives no matter what species we are." In these times, the grieving we feel over the plight of the planet so easily

overwhelms us with fear, anger and despair. With the environmental crisis and the exhaustion of widespread tragedies we are also experiencing a crisis of hope. Kelsey asks if this is the only story to be told, one of doom and gloom, or can we counterbalance this by, "looking at the capacity of this glorious complex planet," and letting it move us into a narrative of hope for the planet.

RITUAL

Calling on the Four Elements

(for the Facilitators – see the ritual set up on the last page)

Leader: Let Us Begin

The natural world continually reflects hope to us. Let us celebrate and listen to its voice in our ritual, as we pray for the grace to grow a story of hope for our beloved planet.

Reader 1:

AIR: O Ruah, Breath of Life, release our capacity to be life givers, we *pray*:

ALL: We join with the earth and each other

One person now comes forward ringing the chimes and places them on the ritual table.

Reader 1 continues:

Air carrying all wing-ed creatures:

Did you know that hundreds of new species of birds and thousands of new insects are discovered each year?

We pray:

All: We join with the earth and each other in hope.

A new species: Meratus jungle flycatcher from Indonesia Photo from Google

Reader 2:

FIRE: O Living Flame, Guiding Light, fill us with compassion for all of creation, **we pray:**

All: We join with the earth and each other

Another person now brings the candle into the centre and places it on the ritual table.

Reader 2 continues:

Did you know that humpback whales are capable of compassion, and will intentionally move in to save other species, such as seals, being attacked by killer whales? **We pray**:

All: We join with the earth and each other in hope.

Reader 1:

WATER: O Deep River, Living Water, may we refresh and restore what is broken, *we pray*:

All: We join with the earth and each other

One person now brings the vessel holding the water into the centre and places it on the ritual table.

Reader 1 continues:

Did you know that coral and fish offspring inherit from their parents, who severely suffered from climate change, a capacity to adapt to the environmental changes they are facing, such as warming water temperatures, and are thriving? **We pray**:

All: We join with the earth and each other in hope.

Reader 2:

EARTH: O Sacred Earth, Our Home, let us be ground, humble and fertile, *we pray*:

All: We join with the earth and each other.

One person now brings the earth or plant into the centre and places it on the ritual table.



Reader 2 continues:

In 2018, after decades of work with many organizations, Chiribiquete National Park in the heart of the Colombian Amazon was expanded by 50% and has been declared a UNESCO World Heritage site.

And as of Jan 2022, there have been 224 new species of animals and plants discovered in the world. **We pray**:

All: We join with the earth and each other in hope.

Leader:

From these examples and many more, Elin Kelsey shows us that, "hope exists within the agency of animals, plants and countless other life-forms that populate this remarkable planet." Hope begets hope when we manifest this "wild contagious gift" that lives inside each one of us. Let us collectively celebrate hope in all the environmental successes and solutions we see around us.

Reader 1: In This Earth

REFLECTION

Leader: The great Catholic writer Ernesto Cardenal in *Abide in Love* observes: "Everything in nature has a trademark, God's trademark: the stripes on a shell and the stripes on a zebra; the grain of the wood and the veins of the dry leaf; the markings on the dragonfly's wings and the pattern of stars on a photographic plate; the panther's coat and the epidermal cells of the lily petal; the structure of atoms and galaxies. All bear God's fingerprints."

Leader: Take 2-5 mins to ponder and then share with a neighbour:

Where do you experience hope for our planet?

<u>Leader:</u> "Triune Lord, wondrous community of infinite love, teach us to contemplate you in the beauty of the universe, for all things speak of you." *Pope Francis, Pentecost 2015*

All: May we live in harmony with the earth.

Voice 1:

May we implement plans to leave the world in a state for future generations to enjoy.

<u>All:</u> May we live in harmony with the earth.

RITUAL SET UP

Have the 4 elements on a table outside the gathering space: **Air** - something that makes a sound such as a chime bar, a bell, wind chimes, a singing bowl, a rain stick, a musical instrument; **Fire**: a burning candle; **Water:** a glass bowl or pitcher with water; **Earth:** a plate with soil or a plant

These elements will be brought up one at a time and placed on the prepared ritual table.

<u>An alternative</u> to this is to have each person with the symbol, when called, weave through the participants to the ritual table. If on Zoom the Leader can hold each symbol up at the appropriate time.

There are 3 opportunities for Readers Voice 1 and Voice 2. From 2-6 readers can be assigned.
