Plastics are not biodegradable. They break down into smaller and smaller pieces, which are ingested by turtles, fish and birds. Eighty-four percent of plastics contain toxins, which pass into animals and our food chain. The oceans are sick, our planet is suffering and life is endangered.

All Social injustice and fashion are directly intertwined with exploitative working conditions, low wages and widespread child labour. We pray that our government leaders will move to create regulations to protect all those harmed by this industry.

Did You Know?



People seldom think of water when they think of plastics. But making a plastic water bottle requires six times as much water as the bottle itself contains.

More than 500 billion plastic bags—one million bags per minute—were produced worldwide last year. Many plastic bags have a working life of a few minutes, followed by an afterlife of centuries. Even after plastics disintegrate, they remain as microplastics, minute particles permeating every niche of life on the planet.
